When to go on Safari

Our World's Ultimate destinations in Southern and Eastern Africa are ideal to visit year round, with each season offering unique experiences. Dry season and also the colder months are between May and August. Due to the scarcity of water and vegetation and only a few natural waterholes, the animals tend to gather in concentrated numbers. The grass is less dense and lower which makes spotting animals easier. The nights can get chilly and close to freezing point the further south you go. Temperatures during the day average between 60 – 68°F. The warm, rainy season generally runs from November to March. It can get really hot at midday and the animals are less active, usually found lying in the shade. Short afternoon thunderstorms are to be expected and nature is flooded with new beginnings. The veld explodes into a lush, green landscape and this also marks the time for baby bucks to be born. The rivers run mighty, making it a truly exciting time to experience nature. Average daytime temperatures are around 82°F.



Private Game Viewing



Game drives at dawn and dusk form the basic rhythm of your safari. Game drives take place in an open game viewing vehicle. Usually an experienced guide/tracker will sit at the front of the vehicle followed by the driver at the steer of the vehicle. These vehicles can follow game into the bush on unmarked roads to maximize viewing of the wildlife without disturbing them.



Botswana

Botswana has very distinct landscapes for you to explore – from the Kalahari Desert, which covers more than half of the country, to the wetlands of the Okavango Delta and the Chobe River. Immerse yourself deep into Africa’s untouched splendor of natural beauty and magnificent wildlife in the Chobe National Park and the Okavango Delta. The Chobe River winds along the northern border of Botswana and is known for some of the best game viewing in Africa. It is also home to the continent’s largest concentration of elephants. The river is flanked by riverine forests, floodplains and open woodlands. Chobe National Park provides excellent game viewing and birding opportunities, with more than 75 mammal species and 450 bird types. It is located in northern Botswana and its life-source is the Chobe River which affords unique water-based game viewing opportunities, such as the unforgettable sight of elephant herds swimming across the river, trunks raised. You can expect huge herds of elephant and buffalo, many antelope and classic plains game species, as well as predators like lion, wild dog, cheetah, crocodile, leopard and the spotted hyena.

Zambia

Experience the beauty of this landlocked country in south-central Africa. Its magnificent wildlife roaming on grass plains stretching as far as the eye can see makes Zambia an unforgettable destination. The Victoria Falls, the world's largest waterfall and a UNESCO World Heritage Site, is one of the greatest attractions in Africa. It is located on the Zambezi River, which forms the border between Zambia and Zimbabwe. It is the only waterfall in the world with a length of more than 0.6 miles and a height of more than 328 ft. The noise of the Victoria Falls can be heard from as far as 24 miles away, while the spray and mist from the falling water rises to a height of over 1 300 ft. The water level varies throughout the year with its peak in April, at the end of the rainy season, and its lowest level in October and early November.







Zimbabwe

Zimbabwe is a landlocked country in Southern Africa known for its dramatic landscape and diverse wildlife, much of it within parks, reserves and safari areas. The Victoria Falls has been described by CNN as one of the Seven Natural Wonders of the world. Taking its place alongside the Pyramids and the Serengeti, Victoria Falls (Mosi-oa-Tunya – the ‘smoke that thunders’) is one of Africa’s original blockbusters. And although Zimbabwe and Zambia share it, Victoria Falls is a place all of its own. As a magnet for tourists of all descriptions – backpackers, tour groups, thrill seekers, families, and honeymooners – Victoria Falls is one of Earth’s great spectacles. View it directly as a raging mile-long curtain of water, in all its glory, from a helicopter ride or peek precariously over its edge from Devil’s Pools; the sheer power and force of the falls is something that simply does not disappoint. Whether you’re here purely to take in the sight of a natural wonder of the world, or for a serious hit of adrenalin via rafting or bungee jumping into the Zambezi, Victoria Falls is a place where you’re sure to tick off numerous items from that bucket list.

Kenya

Kenya was immortalized as the home of the safari by legendary personalities such as Ernest Hemingway and Karen Blixen. Nairobi is Kenya's bustling capital city, often used as a jumping-off point for safari trips. East Africa's most cosmopolitan city, Nairobi is Kenya's beating heart, an exciting, maddening concrete jungle that jarringly counterpoints the natural beauty to be found elsewhere in the country. The Maasai Mara National Reserve is an area of preserved savannah wilderness in southwestern Kenya, along the Tanzanian border. The Maasai Mara is one of the world's most famous National Parks and is home to the Great Migration, together with the Serengeti National Park in Tanzania. These parks are known for their open short grass plains with abundant wildlife. Its animals include lions, cheetahs, elephants, zebras and hippos. Wildebeest traverse its plains during their annual migration. The landscape has grassy plains and rolling hills, and is crossed by the Mara and Talek rivers. The area nearby is dotted with villages (enkangs) of Maasai people. The Great Migration is a natural phenomenon determined by the availability of grazing for wildebeest and zebras. As the rains end in May in the south eastern part of the Serengeti, the animals start moving northwest into areas around the Grumeti River, where they typically remain until late June. Their biggest obstacle, the crossing of the crocodile infested Grumeti and Mara rivers into the Maasai Mara, begins in July.



Tanzania

Tanzania offers you compelling beauty and nature at her most extravagant, including Africa's highest mountain, Mount Kilimanjaro, standing at 19,340 ft. There are numerous National Parks in Tanzania, each offering something truly unique. The Serengeti National Park, a World Heritage Site, is renowned for its large lion population and is one of the best places to observe prides in their natural environment. It is also home to The Great Migration together with the Maasai Mara in Kenya. The Great Migration returns to the Serengeti around late October/November as the herds start migrating south once again. The precise timing of the wildebeest migration is entirely dependent upon the rainfall patterns each year. The Ngorongoro Conservation Area is home to the Ngorongoro Crater, a deep, volcanic crater, the largest unflooded and unbroken caldera in the world. Lake Manyara and Tarangire National Park are in close proximity to the Serengeti and the Ngorongoro Crater. Both parks are smaller and less popular, but definitely worth visiting. Lake Manyara National Park is a protected area in Tanzania's Arusha and Manyara Regions, situated between Lake Manyara and the Great Rift Valley. Tarangire National Park is a national park in Tanzania's Manyara Region. The name of the park originates from the Tarangire River that crosses the park. Arusha, a city in East Africa's Tanzania, is a perfect gateway on route to your safari destinations.

Nowhere are the mountains more majestic than the Virunga volcanoes in the northwest, and hidden among the bamboo forests are some of the world's last remaining mountain gorillas. Expert local guides will bring you face to face with silverback gorillas in the Parc National des Volcans. You will spend between 3-10 hours tracking one of the official gorilla family groups through hillside paths, sometimes crawling through dense vegetation which can at times be challenging. Day 8-10: Fly to Kigali, Rwanda

Fly to Kigali, the vibrant capital city of Rwanda. Lying at the heart of Africa, Rwanda is one of the most dynamic travel destinations. Upon your arrival you will take a 3 hour transfer through the scenic rolling hills of the country to Musanze. Set out early the next morning on your Golden monkeys trek in the Volcanoes national park. These rare species are also listed as endangered – and Volcanoes national park currently has two habituated golden monkeys' troops that are available for visiting by tourists in the park, both of which make about 80 members.

Day 10-11: Gorilla Trek

Spend the day Gorilla trekking. Expert local guides will bring you face to face with silverback gorillas in the Parc National des Volcans. Under guidance from the best, most highly trained people for the job, you find yourself face-to-face with something that seems so unequivocally human, it takes your breath away. The Victoria Falls is located in the Zambezi River, which forms the border between Zambia and Zimbabwe. The noise of Victoria Falls can be heard from as far as 25 miles away, while the spray and mist from the falling water is rising to a height of over 1300 ft.
